Doris McCully passed away on January 24, 2026. Known to her friends as Dot, she had been a volunteer at LLLF since 2016.

Dot and her mustang, Skye, were inseparable from the moment she adopted him. She came to the rescue every day and would do any task necessary. She would feed, water, hay or muck.

She checked on all the animals to ensure their well-being. For example, if she noticed a broken board in a paddock, she would report it. If a gate were left open, she would close it. If a water tub were dry, she would fill it. The animals were her priority.



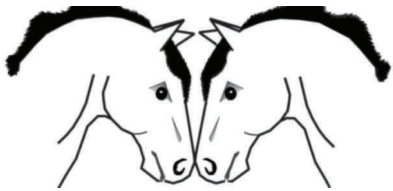
For several years, Dot trained new volunteers and worked closely with them as they learned all the safety protocols. She also helped with administrative tasks.

NEWS FROM THE FARM

Rescue Milestone

2026 marks a milestone for Live and Let Live Farm (LLL) Rescue. It's the 30th anniversary of our founding in 1996, by Teresa Paradis. She had seen the movie, "Namu, the Killer Whale," and was inspired by the phrase, "Live and Let Live," which referred to all creatures living in harmony.



We began with five horses, goats, dogs, cats, and a parrot, and have expanded to an average of 75 horses and approximately 100 companion animals, including many who are pregnant, at any given time.



Some memorable rescues include the Premarins from Manitoba, Canada. This rescue started in October 2004, and concluded in January 2005. It involved 104 horses, 40 of whom were pregnant.

The Northfield stallion rescue began in 2003, and ended in 2014. Five stallions were living in squalor without ever seeing the light of day. Their rescue took 11 years to complete due to local politics.

In October 2013, six mustang foals arrived from NM. We coordinated with various organizations to save these orphans whose dams had been rounded up by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and sent to Mexico to be slaughtered.

We will continue to rescue animals in need because, in many instances, we are their last hope of finding a loving, forever home.

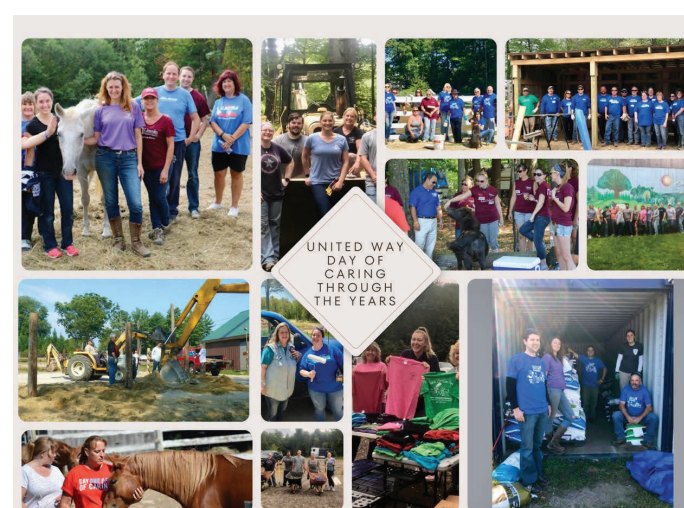

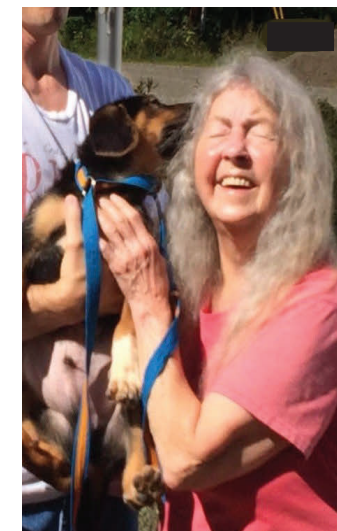
## In Memoriam
