So Many Animals Need Help

Live and Let Live Farm Rescue continues to be inundated with pregnant dogs and cats mostly from the South because spaying and neutering are not commonplace in that part of the country. Here are two of our recent rescue situations.

Nina

Nina, a two-year-old chocolate lab mix, gave birth to seven puppies on Christmas morning at LLLF. She was rescued from the streets of Texas, emaciated, plagued by parasites, pregnant, and missing an eye.

She and her puppies are doing well in a foster home and will be available for adoption soon.



Hopeful

Hopeful, a young rescue x, about two-years-old, was rescued in Georgia with nine puppies. Her owner had died, and she was abandoned. She was emaciated from being severely underweight and had deep wounds on her neck from a collar that was too tight.



She and her puppies are doing well since entering a foster home.

The puppies will be available for adoption when they are 10-12 weeks old, and Hopeful will also be looking for her forever home in the future.

Pilots N Paws to the Rescue



Pilots N Paws is a nonprofit rescue organization comprised of volunteer pilots and their airplanes. They fly animals in dire situations around the country, including from high-kill shelters, to rescues that can help these animals find homes where they can live the life that they deserve with new adoptive families.

Live and Let Live Farm Rescue welcomed its first Pilots N Paws flight on Christmas weekend into the Concord, NH, airport. Five Georgia puppies, Hondo, Sadie, Lola, Chloe, and Tilly, all less than a year old,

were onboard.

Each puppy had experienced a rough life before being rescued.

Hondo was chained in a backyard, emaciated, and doused with gasoline to treat fleas. As a result, this young pup has burn scars on his body from the firepit.



Sadie, Lola and Chloe were owned by hoarders who tried to abandon their dogs in the woods and drown others before animal control could save them.

Tilly was abandoned on the streets, starved, and had mange. She was rescued just before she was scheduled to be euthanized at a Georgia kill shelter.

We are happy to report that these puppies have all been adopted into loving, forever homes.

Live and Let Live Farm Rescue is grateful to everyone involved in their rescue, especially Pilots N Paws, and looks

forward to future freedom flights.



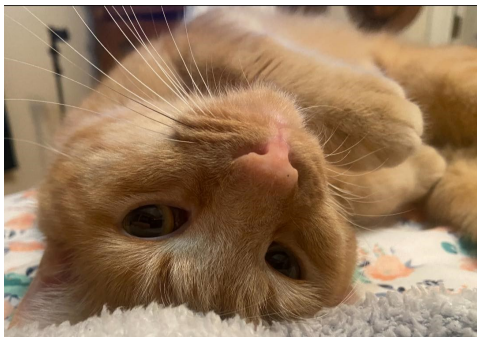
